

NEW LAKE NAMES AND SIGNS

We all fear hitting one of the many lakes around the course...well now there is a name for that. It might be a "Dosenberger", a "Thomas" or a "Lang". In recognition of their commitment to making Balfour Golf Course happen, we have named 3 key lakes after each of Nick Dosenberger, Dave Thomas and Ron Lang. Our historian, Pat Little spearheaded the idea and did some, uh, "digging" into the past and found some good dirt on these three key pioneers:

Thomas Lake – Hole 1

In 1985, Dave Thomas, as a member of the Balfour Recreation Commission (BRC), proposed a local golf course. Over the following few years, with his leadership and hard work, ploughed through numerous financial and red-tape hurdles to open doors for the course development. In the fall of 1989 after exhaustive endeavors, Thomas was rewarded with hitting the first shot off the new fairways.

Dosenberger Lake – Hole 8

Nick Dosenberger and his local construction company were retained to collaborate with a small army of committed volunteers to remove trees and brush and level fairways. There were numerous times when the project ran out of money to pay for his heavy equipment and time. Through those regular interruptions, Mr. Dosenberger selflessly reassured the BRC by keeping his machinery onsite and operational at substantial personal cost. It is through his philanthropic contributions of machinery, time, and labour that the long-time Sunshine Bay resident is recognized through naming of the lake left of #8.

Lang Lake – Hole 10

As the front nine emerged, Ron Lang joined the golf course as a regular playing member. An unrelenting local businessman and Board Member of the BRC, Mr. Lang was inspired with the concept of adding nine holes to complete the 18 hole course. Achieving the concept became a significant challenge for the Commission, members, and the Osprey Ridge Golf Estates. Mr. Lang remained unwavering in his belief in the idea. In 2000, the back nine opened, and while the method acquiring those extra fairways appeared unconventional, the end result benefitted the community and golf course. It is for that reason, the lake left of #10 fairway, with its magnetic ball attracting properties, is named after the mercurial Balfour entrepreneur.

SUPER STUFF

Myself and "The Crew" would like to welcome all golfers, whether you're a casual player or an insane golf addict, back to Balfour. I'm very excited about the upcoming season. The course came through the winter in the best condition in its 35 year history. There is no disease damage on greens or fairways, and the little bit of disease that was active under the snow in the rough is quite superficial and will recover quickly with a little sunshine and warm weather. The only damage the course sustained was done by our 4-legged foe, elk. Even though the crew put up snow fences around greens to try to keep the elk off, when a 1000-pound animal decides it's going through, it's going through. Only a few greens were lightly damaged by the big beasts. I wish I could say the same about fairways. The herd definitely did some

partying on a few fairways this winter. We'll do our best to repair what we can, but it will take some "grow in" time for the hoof marks to heal completely. Good thing we'll open playing winter rules, FREE RELIEF from Elk damage.

As far as course improvements are concerned, the crew has been busy since last fall with the following.

- 1. Expansion and levelling of the white/combo tee on #12 to be completed this spring.
- 2. Expansion and levelling of the black tee and blue/combo tee on #13 to be completed this spring.
- 3. Construction of a new forward tee on #16 and #17
- 4. All cart paths received a new layer of road gravel.
- 5. Parking lot and cart storage area received a layer of road gravel.
- 6. Extensive brushing and bush thinning on numerous holes completed.
- 7. Removal of numerous large trees near tee boxes for light and shot making

We've been so busy in the off season I've probably forgotten some other projects we've tackled. I guess what I'm saying is we've been working hard to improve your golf experience here in Balfour.

One other practice that we started a few years ago is aerifying and topdressing greens before we open. By getting this very necessary cultural practice completed early it means no mid-season greens disruption.
